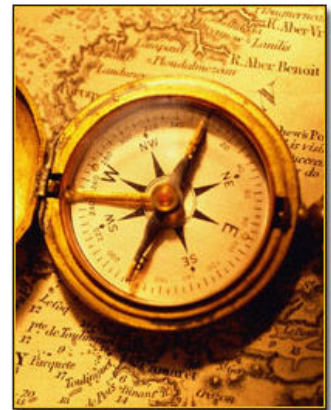

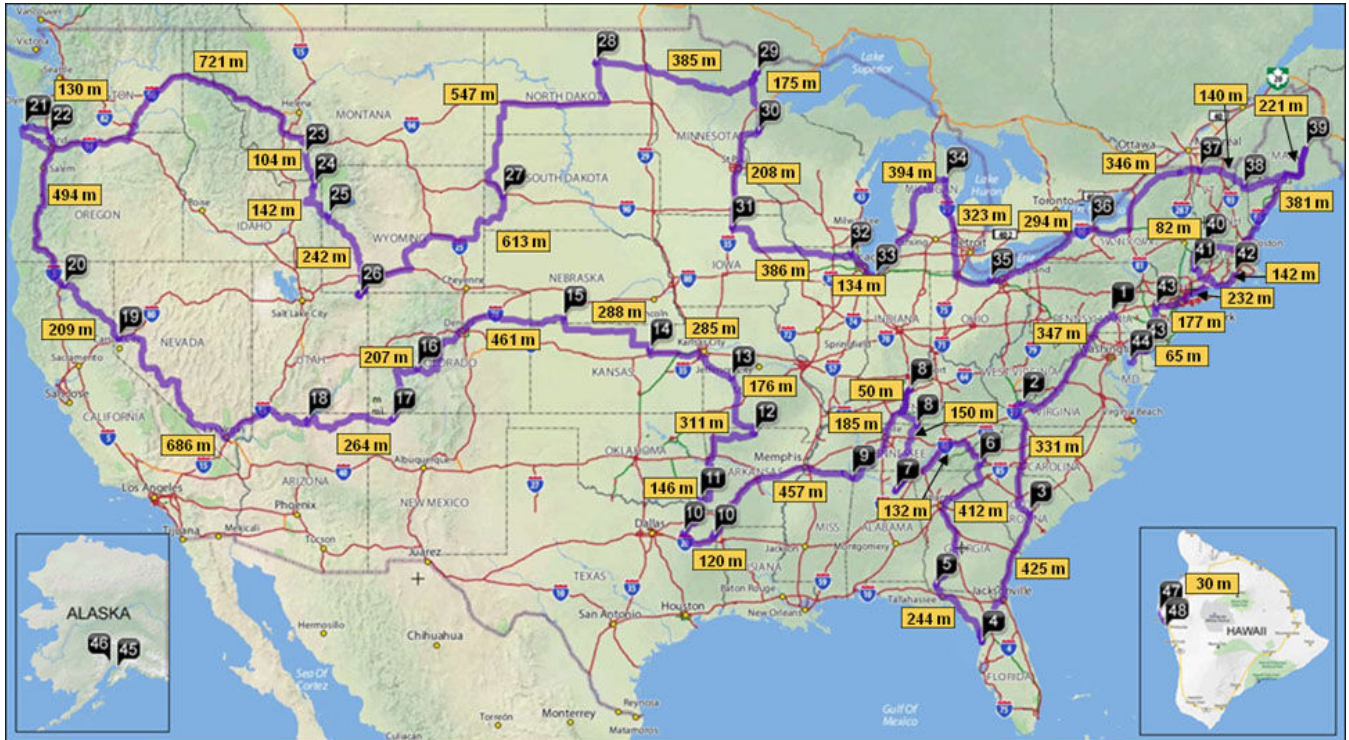

Our 50 Destinations: Our planning has focused on selecting a legitimate trophy water body in each state and a professional guide to aid in each days outing. All driving, planning, and logistics will be performed solely by the two of us. Each day of fishing will involve a target of 4-6 hours on the water in attempting to catch that trophy fish of a lifetime.



Our planning has focused on selecting a legitimate trophy river, lake, or water body in each state and a professional guide to aid us in each days outing. All driving, planning, and logistics will be performed solely by the two of us. Each day of fishing will involve 4-8 hours on the water. We will fish the lower 48 states in 44 days using four doubleheader days. For example, we will fish New Jersey in the morning, drive three hours in the afternoon and fish Delaware in the late afternoon and evening. Because our Maryland destination is only 1 hour away we can be at that destination rested and ready to fish the next morning. We have selected 4 doubleheader days. If we lose a day due to some unforeseen problem we will postpone the outing for that day and move on to the next state in order to maintain all follow-on appointments. We plan to make up any missed states at the end of the trip. Alaska will be fished on day 46. Hawaii will be fished on day 48. This will give us a make up day at the end if needed.

Trophy Fish: The diversity of fish across the United States is vast. Focusing on a single species would simply not do justice to what each state has to offer. Months of research have been conducted in an effort to find each legitimate fishing location. Arguably, each state has many candidates so this was very difficult. We poured over dozens of books and periodicals and hundreds of websites in this process. Other considerations included determining the optimal fish for each state based upon the time of year, water temperature, spawning cycle, and available guides in an area. The location or proximity of any particular water body was not a consideration. Only after the 50 sites were first selected did we plot their locations on a map and assess the travel route to reach them. The trophy fish targeted will include:

Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs):

1. Is this a Commercial Venture? No, this is simply a father and son experiencing an epic adventure together. We tell our story to encourage other fathers and sons to seek ways to build their relationship. We are working hard to involve numerous charities on the project which share a common vision. Examples include Men's Fellowships, Family Focused Organizations, and anyone who has a heart to reach the fractured relationships between fathers and sons. Several organizations are planning on having their members sponsor the adventure by contributing a dime or quarter for every fish we catch to a worthy cause. We will not profit from any aspect of this project.

2. How are you going to fish 50 states in just 50 days? We will fish the lower 48 states in 44 days using four doubleheaders. For example, we will fish Tennessee in the morning, drive several hours in the afternoon and fish Kentucky in the late afternoon and evening. Because our Mississippi destination is 4 hours away we can be at that destination rested enough and ready to fish the next morning. We have selected 4 doubleheader days which are listed below. If we lose a day due to some unforeseen problem we will postpone the outing for that day and move on to the next state in order to maintain all follow-on appointments. We plan to make up any missed states at the end of the trip. Alaska will be fished on day 46. Hawaii will be fished on day 48. This will give us a make up day at the end if needed.

3. How did you select each state's trophy water? Research began in July, 2008 to find each legitimate fishing location. Arguably, each state has many candidates so this was very difficult. We poured over dozens of books and periodicals, reviewed hundreds of websites, and interviewed local experts in this process. Key factors for each state included determining the impact of water temperature, water flow, water clarity, spawning cycles, and quantity of guides in an area. One interesting method involved reviewing the date stamps on the bottom of uploaded fish pictures to various websites. The location or proximity of any particular water body was not a consideration. Only after the 50 sites were first selected did we plot their locations on a map and assess the travel route to reach them.

4. Are you driving to all 48 of the lower 48 states? Yes. We will use an RV to cover the lower 48 states and fly to Alaska and Hawaii. One exception would be if we need to make-up any postponed states at the end. If this happens we will fly from Hawaii to that state.

5. Are you driving to Alaska? No. We will fly from Washington D.C. to Alaska upon completion of our 46th state (Maryland).

6. Will this be a World Record? We can not find any evidence that there is a record of this type. It must be noted that it is not our intention to try to set a record. Our goal is to experience an amazing adventure together and bring attention to father/son relationships. If this has been attempted before - we applaud the achievement and would love nothing more than to meet the the father-son team.

7. Where do you plan to start first? This has been a very challenging issue. As most people know, the best time to fish depends on the fish and the season. For bass, it is best to target the spring. For catfish, it is often best to target the summer. For trout, you need to consider the heavy spring run-off and not start too early. For salmon, the spawning patterns differ from place to place. Many fish also move to deeper water as the summer temperatures increase which make them harder to catch. With these issues and many more we believe we can maximize our success by starting in Pennsylvania and moving clockwise. This will enable us to fish the southern states as early as possible and normalize the impact of summer heat across the entire trip.

- 8. What direction are you planning to drive?** We will travel clockwise, starting in Pennsylvania. See map.
- 9. Are you going to purchase fishing licenses in every state?** Yes. Fortunately, fishing licenses for nearly every state can be purchased in advance and on-line. In a few cases, the guides maintain the licenses necessary.
- 10. What kind of vehicle will you travel in?** We plan to use a small Class-C Recreational Vehicle (RV) which sleeps two people comfortably to travel the lower 48 states. We believe a small and agile RV will give us the maximum flexibility as we travel off major highways. We will also be able to take a shower, prepare our meals, and maintain a permanent environment to support our many daily activities.
- 11. Will you be also sleeping in the RV?** Yes. In order to minimize logistics, travel time, and road miles we will be coordinating with each local guide to identify a location each night for our RV to park. In most cases there is a campground within 5 miles of our morning launch site.
- 12. What happens if your RV breaks down?** We will work feverishly to have our RV repaired as quickly as possible. We will rely heavily on our navigation system to quickly identify resources in the area.
- 13. What happens if your RV breaks down in the middle of nowhere?** We will be carrying a motorcycle for extreme emergencies. For example, this will be important in the event we break down in a region where cell phone coverage is lost and we must quickly travel for help.
- 14. Do you have a Plan-B for everything?** We are making provisions for nearly everything – within reason. The planning phase for this event began in July of 2008 so that we would be able to develop a logistics plan for nearly everything along the way.
- 15. Does your son enjoy fishing as much as you?** He has been an avid fisherman since he was about 3 years old. But to be fair, I'm clearly more Type A when it comes to fishing.
- 16. Are the two of you going to share in the driving equally?** Hopefully, Yes. Our desire is to split this responsibility 50/50.
- 17. What will you do if one of you gets sick and you lose a day?** The other person will take over driving to the next state and we will make-up that state at the end of the trip.
- 18. Why did you choose to start on June 13th?** This was simple. We will begin our trip immediately following Taylor's last day of High School.
- 19. Are you planning on recording what you catch?** Yes. We will document everything we catch and provide a detailed accounting. We will also capture photographs and video where possible. We will ask our guides to certify what we catch as well.
- 20. What kind of computer resources will you have with you?** We will have multiple laptop computers, multiple backup hard drives, wireless broadband connectivity for each laptop, an in-car navigation system, multiple cellphones with different cellular carriers to minimize connectivity problems across the nation, multiple digital cameras, digital video camera, and a voice recorder..
- 21. Do you plan to make a movie or record your adventure for television?** This is an evolving subject. We will certainly capture lots of video. We plan to use a [GoPro Hero](#) wide-angle video camera where possible to document in full each fish we catch for YouTube uploads. This video camera can attach via Velcro to your vest and capture the entire days fishing for each person in a hands-off way. We plan to post a multitude of videos (YouTube and on our website) to highlight key events as we go along. Whether a professional video documentary is created is dependent upon future outside interests.
- 22. Can I ride along?** This is by far the most common question asked. This reaction certainly validates our claim that we all desire adventure and relationship in our lives. We are considering help in the documenting of the adventure through photo and video. At this point, this is an open question. Our greatest hope is that fathers and sons would use our example to create their own adventures - no matter if it is only for a day, a weekend, or a week.
- 23. Are you planning on fishing for salt water fish anywhere?** Yes. Our goal is to avoid being too legalistic on fish or water type and as such there are several states that have some amazing trophy salt water fish. For example, Hawaii's Blue

Marlin, and Rhode Island and Maryland's Striped Bass.

24. What does your wife think about this adventure? She is very supportive. She worries mostly about the difficulties of the trip, the long hours of driving, and the 7 weeks away from home. But, she clearly believes in the trip's mission and cause.

25. Are you taking a boat? Yes. We plan to take a collapsable/inflatable driftboat with us (FoldCat 375 FC by [Sea Eagle](#)) This is a very durable craft that collapses into a very small form factor. We've rafted literally hundreds of miles on extreme Colorado rivers in the raft and caught hundreds of fish in the process. We can either go motor-less or use a trolling motor for still water.

26. Are you taking a secondary vehicle in case your RV breaks down? We do plan to carry a motorcycle that will attach to the back of the RV. This will be important in the event we break down in a region where cell phone coverage is lost and we must quickly travel for help.

27. What if your guide doesn't show up? We have identified multiple backup guides in the event our guide is a no-show. We will also have our collapsable driftboat in the event that we must fish a particular water alone.

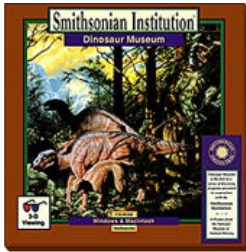
